MISSION

The mission of Bellevue's Parks & Community Services is to build a healthy community through an integrated system of exceptional parks, open spaces, recreation, cultural arts and human services.

KEY COMPONENTS

- Over 2,700 acres of parks and open space
- 90 miles of trails
- 46 playgrounds
- 8,760 linear feet of waterfront
- 7 beach parks
- 5 community centers
- 32 athletic fields managed (27 city-owned and 5 school-owned)
- 2 blueberry farms
- 2 farm-fresh produce stands
- 100 community garden plots (P-patches)
- Oversight of the Adult Probation Division and the Human Services Division that allocates \$7.6 million every two years to agencies supporting Bellevue residents
- Over 35,000 people participate in recreation programs each year through Community Centers (North Bellevue, South Bellevue, Highland, Crossroads and Northwest Arts Center); Older Adult Programs; Bellevue Youth Theatre; Teen Services / Youth Link; Youth Sports; Skateparks – Highland Center Skate Park & Plaza, Lakemont, Crossroads Park; Wrap-Around Services; Adaptive Recreation Programs; Bellevue Youth Court; Kelsey Creek Community Farm; and Day Camps
- More than 6,427 people volunteer annually to support a wide variety of programs and services throughout the department. In 2016, volunteer services were estimated to be worth more than \$3 million.
